The Evolution Of A Pickleball Venue - Kalawai Park

Locals and visitors alike oftentimes ask how a particular location on Kaua'i became a pickleball venue. Kalawai Park in Kalaheo was the subject of such a question a few times these past few weeks, so for the record......



The two tennis court facility at Kalawai Park was first used for organized pickleball play on the afternoon of March 31, 2017. Look closely and you will see makeshift chalked lines. We played for two hours. Eight players attended. Pictured: Barbara Howard, Theresa Della Lana, Dick Furtado (visitor) and Mike Folster. The tennis net was used. Slide the top of the center strap over ten net squares and you have 34 inches in height (locals measurement).





After a month of play, we received permission to paint permanent lines. Date: May 3, 2017. Our work crew did a nice job (locals paint crew).
